1. Who did God choose to make a blessing to all nations?
Abraham
2. Was Abraham righteous when God called him?
No, he worshipped idols.
3. When was Abraham declared righteous?
When the Bible said he believed God.
4. What kind of covenant did God make with Abraham?
An unconditional covenant.
5. What is an unconditional covenant?
A covenant rooted in the faithfulness of God alone.
6. What did God promise Abraham in His unconditional covenant?
God promised Abraham land, that he would have descendants, and that all the families of the earth would be blessed through Him.
7. What was the name of Abraham's son conceived through the flesh?
Ishmael, who was conceived by a slave woman.
8. What is the name of Abraham's son conceived through the promise of God?
Isaac, who was conceived by Abraham's wife, Sarah, according to the promise of God.
9. What became of Ishmael?
God said he would become a great nation but his hand would be against everyone and everyone's hand against him.
10. Who was Isaac's first-born son?
Esau was the Isaac's firstborn.
11. Did Esau get the firstborn blessing?
No, the younger son Jacob received the blessing through trickery.
12. Did Jacob need to resort to trickery to get the firstborn blessing?
No, God had already promised that the older son would serve the younger.
13. What did God change Jacob's name to?
Israel.
14. What does the name Israel mean?
One who wrestles with God.
15. How many sons did Jacob have?
Twelve sons
16. Which of Jacob's sons was sold into slavery by his brothers?
Joseph.
17. Why did Joseph's brothers sell him into slavery?
Jacob loved Joseph more and it made his brothers jealous.
18. Where did Joseph end up after being sold by his brothers?
Joseph was enslaved in Egypt.
19. What did Joseph's brothers do to deceive their father Jacob?
They dipped Joseph's coat in blood and told Jacob an animal killed him.
20. What became of Joseph in Egypt?
God was with him and he gained favor with the Pharaoh of Egypt.
21. How did Joseph provide food to his family during a famine?
Pharaoh made Joseph 2nd in charge of all of Egypt, including selling food.
22. Did Joseph's brothers recognize him when they came to buy food?
No, but Joseph recognized them and treated them roughly before showing mercy.

23. What became of Jacob's family when they reunited with Joseph in Egypt?
Jacob and his eleven sons moved to Egypt.

24. What became of the Israelites in Egypt?
They multiplied greatly, and then Egypt enslaved the Israelites out of fear.

25. Who are the twelve tribes of Israel that received a portion of the Promised Land?
Rueben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Issachar, Zebulun, Benjamin, Ephraim and Manasseh.

26. Which of Jacob's sons received a double blessing?
Joseph did because his two sons, Manasseh and Ephraim, both received a portion of land in Canaan.

27. Which of Jacob's sons did not receive a portion of the Promised Land?
The tribe of Levi

28. What did the tribe of Levi receive instead of land?
God is their inheritance.

29. Did Jacob's firstborn son receive the blessing?
No, Joseph's son Ephraim received the physical blessing and Judah received the promise that his descendent would rule.

30. How many years were the Israelites enslaved in Egypt?
Four hundred and thirty years

31. Who did God raise up to deliver the Israelites?
Moses, from the tribe of Levi.

32. Where did Moses grow up?
Moses was adopted by Pharaoh's daughter.

33. How many plagues did God send to Egypt before the Israelites were set free?
Ten

34. What was the final plague?

35. Why did Israelite children not die?
They obeyed God, sacrificed a lamb and placed the blood over their doors.

36. Did the Israelites leave in poverty?
No, God had the Egyptians give them great wealth.

37. What did the Israelites do with that wealth?
They joyfully gave it to build God's temple.

38. What did God give to Moses on Mt. Sinai?
The Torah (Law)

39. Did Israel agree to keep the Torah?
Yes.

40. What did God promise to do if Israel did not keep their promise?
To curse them and remove them from the land He promised Abraham.

41. Did Israel keep the promise to obey the Torah (Law)?
No, so they were sent into exile as God promised.

42. Did God only promise exile if they disobeyed him?
No, he also promised to bring the nation of Israel back to their land.

43. Did God choose Israel because they were the best nation?
No, God chose them because it gave Him pleasure.

44. How many feasts did God give Israel?
Seven feasts or appointed times.

45. Are Gentiles required to keep the feasts?
No, they were only for the tribes of Israel.

46. What are the Spring Feasts?

Passover, Feast of Unleavened Bread, Firstfruits, and Feast of Weeks (also called Pentecost).

47. What are the Fall Feasts?

Feast of Trumpets, The Day of Atonement, and The Feast of Tabernacles (also called Booths).

48. What do we learn from the Passover feast?

Death passed over the firstborn of Israelite families, so God can deliver from death. And the Passover lamb pointed to Jesus.

49. What can we learn from Feast of Unleavened bread?

Sin is the problem and it needs to be removed. Jesus is the "Bread of Life" without sin. In Christ, believers are cleansed from sin.

50. What can we learn from Feast of Firstfruits?

God is the one who gives the harvest and Jesus is the firstfruits of those that will rise from the dead.

51. What can we learn from Feast of Weeks (Pentecost)?

Fifty days after Firstfruits, God gave the Torah and fifty days after Jesus rose from the dead, God gave the Holy Spirit.

52. What is special about the Fall Feasts?

Each has a past lesson and a future lesson.

53. What can we learn from Feast of Trumpets?

Israel celebrates the New Year, the birth of creation. One day the trumpet will sound and Jesus will come for his Church.

54. What can we learn from the Day of Atonement?

The one day a year when the High Priest would enter the Holy of Holies to make atonement for Israel and the future day Christ will physically return to earth.

55. What can we learn from Feast of Tabernacles (Booths)?

God provided in the wilderness when Israel left Egypt. One day believers will dwell with God.

56. What is Jubilee?

Every fifty years liberty would be proclaimed through all the land and all the property held by unpaid debts would be returned and all captives were released.

57. What did Moses do when Israel reached the border of the Promised Land?

He sent twelve spies to spy out the land God was giving them.

58. What report did the twelve spies sent out by Moses to inspect the Promised Land give?

Ten spies reported in fear while two reported with faith in God.

59. What are the names of the two spies who reported in faith?

Joshua, son of Nun, and Caleb from the tribe of Judah

60. What did God do when the people listened to the ten fearful spies?

God made Israel wander in the wilderness for forty years.

61. Did Moses lead Israel into the Promised Land?

No, he disobeyed God and did not get to enter the Promised Land.

62. Who led Israel into the Promised Land?

Joshua, son of Nun led Israel into the Promised Land.

63. Did Israel drive out all the people dwelling in the Promised Land?

No, after Joshua died, the next generation did not follow God and lost their battles.

64. Who did God send to help guide Israel after Joseph died?

God sent judges, who temporarily guided and delivered Israel from its' enemies.

65. Name some judges from the Bible?

Gideon, Deborah, Samson, and Samuel were all judges.

66. Who was Samuel?

Samuel was the last judge and the prophet who anointed Israel's first king.

67. How did Israel reject God as their ruler?

Israel asked for a king like the other nations.

68. Who was Israel's first king?

God gave Saul from the tribe of Benjamin as Israel's first king.

69. Who was Israel's Second King?

David from the tribe of Judah. 70. What did God promise King David? God promised David that someone from his family line would be the Messiah, and his kingdom would endure forever.

71. Which of David's sons was his successor as king?

Solomon, son of Sheba whose husband Uriah, David had killed.

72. Who built the Temple in Jerusalem?

God let Solomon build it since David was a man of blood.

73. Did Solomon remain faithful?

No, Solomon did not heed God's instruction and was led into idolatry by foreign women.

74. What consequence came as a result of Solomon's idolatry?

The Kingdom divided into two: The Northern Kingdom and Southern Kingdom.

75. How many tribes were in the Northern Kingdom?

Ten tribes.

76. What two tribes stayed faithful to David's line of rule?

The tribe of Benjamin and Judah.

77. What was the capital city of the Northern Kingdom?

Samaria

78. What was the capital city of the Southern Kingdom?
Jerusalem was, is, and will always be the Holy City.

79. Why were both Kingdoms conquered?

Because of their continued idolatry God scattered them as He promised He would.

80. What year was the Northern Kingdom conquered by the Assyrians?

In 722 B.C.

81. What year was the Southern Kingdom conquered by the Babylonians?

It was conquered in 607 and the Temple destroyed in 586 B.C.

82. What other names does the Bible call the Northern Kingdom?

Ephraim and The House of Israel.

83. What other name does the Bible call the Southern Kingdom?

Judah.

84. How many kings ruled the Northern Kingdom?

God anointed nineteen different kings but they were all evil and none of them were from David's line.

85. How many kings ruled the Southern Kingdom?

God anointed twenty different kings, six were good and all were from David's line.

86. Did the tribes of Israel ever return to the land God promised them?

As God prophesied, Cyrus King of Persia let the Southern Kingdom exiles return to Israel. Many of the northern tribes returned but not in the same prophetic manner.

87. Who was Elijah?

A prophet during the wicked King Ahab's reign who performed many miracles and destroyed the prophets of Baal.

88. What did Ezekiel the prophet prophesy about?
Ezekiel warned of Israel's destruction, but promised a new spirit would be given and that God would reunify Israel.

89. What did Isaiah prophesy?
Isaiah warned of Judah's destruction but gave many prophecies about the coming Messiah.

90. Who is Ezra?
A priestly descendent of Aaron who returned after the Babylonian exile and reintroduced the Torah (Law) to Israel.

91. Who led the first return of Israelites from exile?
Zerubbabel led the first group of Israelites back to Jerusalem after seventy years of exile and rebuilt the Temple.

92. Who led the second return of Israelites from exile?
Ezra the scribe led the second group of Israelites back to Jerusalem and restored Temple worship.

93. Who led the third return of Israelites from exile?
Nehemiah led the third group of Israelites back and rebuilt the Temple wall.

94. Led by Nehemiah, how long did it take to rebuild the wall in Jerusalem?
It only took fifty-two days.

95. Why was the second Temple not as good as the first?
It was without the Ark of the Covenant, so God's presence was not there like before.

96. Who is Esther?
A young Israelite who became a queen of Persia during the exile.

97. What did Esther do?
Queen Esther listened to wise counsel, risked her life, and stopped a plan to exterminate all Jews.

98. Who was Malachi?
Malachi was the final prophet God sent to Israel before sending John the Baptist 400 years later.

99. Who was John the Baptist?
John the Baptist was the last Old Testament prophet and he was the forerunner of the Messiah.

100. What did John the Baptist say when Jesus approached him?
"Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."
